**Plan Your Journey** - Make use of journey planning applications to check for convenient and sustainable travel options, particularly for off-site meetings.

**Walk and Cycle** - Walking and cycling are the most sustainable modes of transport and are also a good way to keep fit and healthy.

**Consider Public Transport** - This is a great way to get around while helping to lower congestion on the local road network and you don't have to worry about a parking space.

**Consider Car sharing**- It is a great way to share the cost of fuel while also giving you time to relax on your daily commute.

**Think Ahead** - Bundle a number of small errands into one trip to save time and fuel.

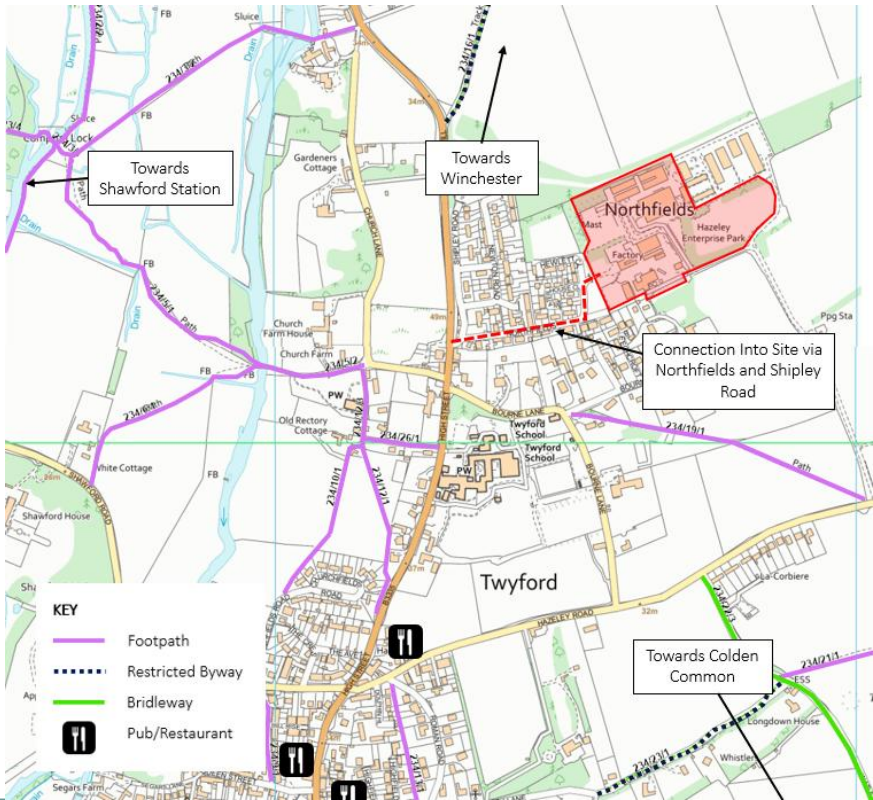

# Walking & Cycling

Both walking and cycling are great ways to travel, whether it is to and from work if you live in the local area, or just on your break!

In addition to the local footways on Northfields and B3335, Hazeley Enterprise Park is close to a number of Public Right of Way (PRoW) footpaths and bridleways which you can use to get from Point A to Point B. If you're cycling into work, don't forget that there is on-site covered cycle parking available. In addition to this, your place of work has a shower and changing facilities available. You may also be able to ask your company if they can help you purchase a bike through the 'cycle to work' salary sacrifice scheme – for more details on this, contact your line manager.

# Bus Services



Regular bus services provide Hazeley Enterprise Park with links from Fareham to Winchester!

The local area is served by the 69 Stagecoach bus service from the 'Northfields' bus stops, located either side of the Coxs Hill/High Street. The stops have sheltered seating and timetable information.

The southbound bus stop (to Fareham) is located just a 4-minute walk or 1-minute cycle from the site entrance, whilst the northbound bus stop (to Winchester) is a 5-minute walk or 2-minute cycle.

The table below summarises the main stops on the 69 service and bus times from the 'Northfields' bus stop.

## Why take the bus?

- The walk to and from the bus is a great way to bring some physical activity into your daily routine
- Relax and read a book whilst you travel to your destination
- Season tickets offer unlimited travel on services and can prove cheaper than running a car

# Rail Services



Shawford Station is located approximately 2.9km from Hazeley Enterprise Park accessible within a 28-minute walk via PRow routes 234/26/1 and 234/10/1 or a 12-minute cycle.

The station, which is operated by South-Western Railway, provides hourly services to Winchester and Southampton Central, with additional stops to Eastleigh and Southampton Airport Parkway.

Additional services to Bournemouth, Basingstoke and London Waterloo are provided in peak hours.

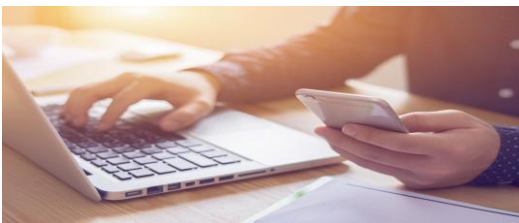
